London, July 15.—The Australian and Spanish Davis Cup tennis teams today completed their victories in the preliminary tournaments over their Czechoslovakian and Indian opponents. The Australians, having previously won two singles matches from the Czechoslovakians, clinched the tournament today at Roehampton by defeating them in the doubles match, 9-7, 6-0, 6-3.
